Results Delivered

Daily Office Operations

77% APAA Members seek recovery support services such as job readiness, housing referrals, and coaching. They accomplish this within 1-2 office visit which consists of 38% of office visits.

Long Term Recovery

23% of APAA's Active Members visit & participate in support groups, daily peer huddles, membership meetings, and jamming n recovery dance. These account for 62% of APAA visits.

Second Major Goal

To collaborate with community entities to facilitate access to resources for APAA members; and to help members establish a strong support system to reduce the risk of relapse.

To educate the community about addiction, long-term recovery, and to increase awareness of APAA in efforts to minimize the stigma & discrimination associated with addiction recovery.

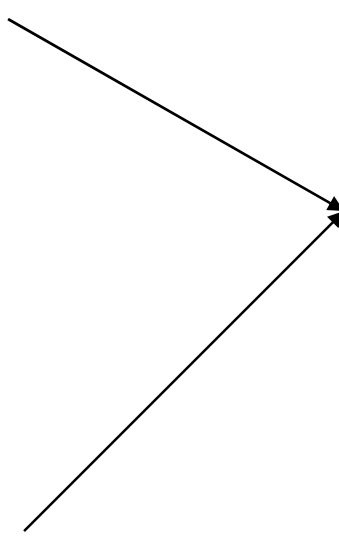
